7 **Committee Note:**

8 The Executive Appropriations Committee recommended this bill.

9 **General Description:**

10 This bill supplements or reduces appropriations previously provided for the support and
11 operation of state government for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017 and ending June 30, 2018;
12 and appropriates funds for the support and operation of state government for the fiscal year
13 beginning July 1, 2018 and ending June 30, 2019.

14 **Highlighted Provisions:**

15 This bill:

- 16 ▶ provides appropriations for the use and support of certain state agencies;
17 ▶ provides appropriations for other purposes as described;
18 ▶ approves employment levels for internal service funds; and
19 ▶ approves capital acquisition amounts for internal service funds.

20 **Money Appropriated in this Bill:**

21 This bill appropriates \$6,629,600 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2018.

22 This bill appropriates \$48,961,400 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2019,
23 including:

- 24 ▶ \$1,099,000 from the General Fund;
25 ▶ \$23,776,700 from the Education Fund;
26 ▶ \$24,085,700 from various sources as detailed in this bill.

27 This bill appropriates \$14,223,700 in business-like activities for fiscal year 2019.

28 **Other Special Clauses:**

29 Section 1 of this bill takes effect immediately. Section 2 of this bill takes effect on July 1,

116 Subsection 2(b). **Business-like Activities.** The Legislature has reviewed the following
 117 proprietary funds. Under the terms and conditions of Utah Code 63J-1-410, for any included Internal
 118 Service Fund, the Legislature approves budgets, full-time permanent positions, and capital
 119 acquisition amounts as indicated, and appropriates to the funds, as indicated, estimated revenue from
 120 rates, fees, and other charges. The Legislature authorizes the State Division of Finance to transfer
 121 amounts between funds and accounts as indicated.

135 Section 3. **Effective Date.**

136 If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, Section 1 of this bill
 137 takes effect upon approval by the Governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of
 138 Utah Constitution Article VII, Section 8 without the Governor's signature, or in the case of a veto,
 139 the date of override. Section 2 of this bill takes effect on July 1, 2018.

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
