



DORA Clients Who Increase Their Employment

This outcome measure reflects the percent increase in DORA client employment from admission to discharge. The division's goal is to "see higher involvement in work and school as a result of participating in substance abuse treatment services."



Decrease in the Percent of DORA Clients Arrested

This outcome measure reflects the percent decrease in arrests from admission to discharge for DORA clients. It is calculated by the percent arrested at 30 days prior to admission minus the percent arrested 30 days prior to discharge, divided by the percent arrested 30 days prior to admission.
