

Teasdale Cultural Hall
 Preservation Stabilization Project



Overview of project: originally constructed in 1917, and largely financed by the people of Teasdale, the Teasdale Cultural Hall was built to provide a place of amusement and recreation, theatrical purposes, accommodating people of the county. The building is in need of repair, renovation and stabilization.

The Teasdale Historical Society has been organized as a non-profit organization and the first project for the group will be to save the Cultural Hall.

The Teasdale Cultural Hall will be used in the future, as it was originally intended when constructed - recreation, theatrical purposes and more. A goal of the THS is to cover operations & maintenance fees by rental fees for the building. The building will be marketed to host family reunions, festivals, quilt shows, community theatre and more.

Phase 1 will concentrate on the repair and stabilization of the building and fundraising will focus on funding to cover construction. Phase 2 will fully develop the operations of the building and funding to cover operations & maintenance costs.
