

Medical Interpretation Training Request

Purpose: To develop and implement high quality course to train medical interpreters in refugee languages to the standards expected by the medical interpretation bill SB0074 passed in 2017.

This funding would require a board including higher education, RSO to oversee the training and support providing a stipend for refugees to cover the cost of the class.

Performance Measures:

1. By 2019 develop a 40-60 hour a week curriculum for medical interpreter training that would be approved by the board and is approved by DOPL.
2. BY 2020 begin the implementation of the class and train the first cohort of 15-20 individuals.
