


Mental Health America


We're Trapped in Stage 4 Thinking








Utah Ranking: 2016-2018













Utah Youth Screening Data

- Utah Screening Data








Utah Steps Taken


- Mental Health Crisis Line Amendment

Costs of delayed response

- Incarceration
- Hospitalization
