Strengths in Utah Higher Education

- Lowest student debt, lowest % of students taking on debt
- 1/2 of Utah high school students take concurrent enrollmentsaving over \$41m in tuition
- 6 of 8 institutions are open-admission
- 3rd lowest tuition in the country (4 year)
- 112 certificates & degrees entirely online
- 45% of USHE students are enrolled in at least one of the 2,000 courses available online

- Coordinated general education eases transfer of lower-division courses...for those well on their way to completing:
 - Example: 50% of students who start at SLCC finish at the UU

But...


- Only 1 in 5 students who graduate stay at the same institution and major they start in.
- Utah is often among the top states of students with "some college, no degree".
