
Primary Care Workforce in Utah

- 207.5 physicians per 100,000 people (ranking 43rd in the nation)
- ► 65 active primary care physicians per 100,000 people (ranking 49th in the nation)
- ► 55.5 primary care physicians per 100,000 people in rural counties (ranking 24th of 47 states with rural counties in the nation)
- ▶ 1.9 psychiatrists per 100,000 people in rural counties (ranking 39th of 47 states with rural counties in the nation)




Maldistribution of Primary Care Workforce






Health Professional Shortage Areas

A geographic area or facility that has too few providers to meet the needs of the population, determined by federal designation guidelines.



HPSA Types and Disciplines

 - Primary Medical Care
 - Family Medicine
 - Internal Medicine
 - Pediatrics
 - Obstetrics and Gynecology
 - Dental Health
 - General Dentistry
 - Mental Health
 - Psychiatry



HPSA Types and Disciplines

► HPSA Types

- Geographic: Based solely on the total number of providers and the population in a rational geographic area
- Geographic with high unmet needs: Based on certain health and/or socioeconomic indicators, the population, and the total number of providers in a rational geographic area
- Population: Special population groups (i.e. low-income, Medicaid eligible, homeless) and the number of providers serving that population within a rational geographic area
- Facility: A facility that serves a special population and meets predetermined requirements to be considered a HPSA








Utah's Primary Medical Care Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSA)






Utah's Dental Health Health Professional Shortage Areas


Rural Physician Loan Repayment Program and Healthcare Workforce Financial Assistance Program



Rural Physician Loan Repayment Program

- ► Since FY 2016
- Ongoing funding in the amount of \$300,000.00, for awards and program administrative costs.
- ► This allows our office to award 9 rural physicians \$15,000.00 a year for a two-year contract totaling \$30,000.00.
- ▶ Within the contract, Hospitals are required to match minimum \$1 to \$1 of state funds, bringing the total physician contract amount to \$60,000.00 for two years.
- ► FY 2016: 9 new providers and \$270,000 in funding.
- ► FY 2017: 9 new providers and \$270,000 in funding.
- ► FY 2018: 9 new providers and \$270,000 in funding.





Healthcare Workforce Financial Assistance Program


- Created in 2009, not funded in FY 2014 and FY 2015
- Program Funding:
 - > FY 2016, \$600,000 (one-time)
 - > FY 2017, \$0
 - > FY 2018, \$350,000(one-time)
 - FY 2019, \$250,000 (one-time)
 - UDOH applied for \$225,000 in matching funds from the federal SLRP program.
 - Requires 50/50 match.
 - No administrative costs allowed.
 - Must be located in a HPSA to qualify.
 - Received Notice of Award 08/06/2018 for \$202,500 (competitive grant)



Conrad 30 J-1 Visa Waiver



What is it?

- ► Foreign physicians that came to the US for residency and/or fellowship are required to return to their home country for two years upon completion of their training.
- ► The Conrad 30 J-1 Visa Waiver program allows them to waive this requirement by contracting to work in a HPSA, or a facility that serves patients from a HPSA.
- ► Thirty spots are available in Utah each year
 - > 20 are for Primary Care Physicians or Psychiatrists working in a HPSA
 - 10 are for ANY provider
 - Specialists inside or outside a HPSA
 - PCPs outside a HPSA, but serving patients from a HPSA
- ► Recruitment tool for Primary Care Providers and Psychiatrists




Requirements

- Employing facility would be required to provide the following information:
 - A letter stating
 - Physician's qualifications
 - Proposed responsibilities
 - Actual work site(s)
 - How his/her employment will satisfy unmet needs
 - A detailed description of the sponsoring employer
 - Statement that the facility is in a HPSA or MUA, or serves patients residing within one
 - Serves Medicare and Medicaid patients and has a sliding fee scale
 - Statement detailing plans to retain physician beyond initial contract
 - A contract for no less than 40 hours a week for three years between the J-1 physician and the sponsoring agency








Data is from 2015-2018. J-1 Visa cycle is from October 1st to September 30th.

Governor's Certified Shortage Areas

- Approved by HRSA in December 2017.
- For Rural Health Clinic (RHC) certification purposes only.
- ► Three tiers:
 - Applies automatically to all 13 FRONTIER counties.
 - Applies to 11 Rural Counties with Population to Provider Ratio of 2,400:1
 - Applies to 11 Rural Counties with Population to Provider Ratio of 1,500:1 and meets one or more of five (5) high needs health indicators:





County Classification:

- Frontier (6 or fewer persons per square mile)
- Rural (more than 6 but less than 100 persons per square mile)
- Urban (100 or more persons per square mile)
