Section 1. Section 77-7-15 is amended to read:
77-7-15. Authority of peace officer to stop and question suspect Grounds.
A peace officer may stop any [person] individual in a public place when the officer has
a reasonable suspicion to believe the [person] individual has committed or is in the act of
committing or is attempting to commit a public offense and may demand the [person's]
individual's name, [address] date of birth, and an explanation of the [person's] individual's
actions.
