Health Care Revisions

- Increase Medicaid income eligibility for adults with dependent children in the home (Parents)
- Create new program for adults without dependent children in the home needing mental health or substance use treatment (Targeted Adult Medicaid)
- Provide Medicaid coverage for residential treatment for those with a substance use disorder




Parent Expansion

- Increased income limits for parents with dependent children living at home
 - Increased income to 60% of the federal poverty level (FPL), approximately \$15,060 annual income for a family of four
- Eligibility changes effective July 1, 2017
- Current enrollment is approximately 4,600

Total Expansion Parents Enrollment by Month



Targeted Adult Medicaid




Expansion for Adults without Dependent Children

- Created three new eligibility groups of adults without dependent children with incomes up to 5% FPL (approximately \$600 annual income for an individual) who are:
 - Chronically homeless
 - Involved in the justice system through probation, parole, or court ordered treatment needing substance abuse or mental health treatment
 - Needing substance abuse treatment or mental health treatment [Due to limited funding, this group has not been opened]
- Approved by CMS and implemented November 1, 2017
- Projected enrollment is approximately 4,000 – 6,000

Total TAM Enrollment By Month


