 - (i) the total number of tickets the person issued for the event;
 - (ii) the number of restricted tickets the person issued for the event;

 - (iv) the type of event; and
- (v) the name of the venue where the event was scheduled to occur;
- (b) (i) for a report submitted in compliance with a July 15 deadline, the number of concert or theater events by venue scheduled during the reporting period; or
