

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Title 26A-1-106(c) requires the Utah Department of Health to establish, by rule, minimum performance standards for 13 local health departments (UAC R380-40).


Services required include but are not limited to:

- **Providing environmental health services:**
 - Food safety
 - Public swimming pools
 - Water quality testing
 - Air quality
 - Solid and hazardous waste monitoring and clean up
- **Identifying leading cause of disease, death and disability and implementing programs to prevent them.**
- **Preparing for public health emergencies:**
 - Testing public health preparedness
 - Accessing emergency response communication equipment
- **Investigating communicable diseases to prevent spread:**
 - Surveillance
 - Monitoring
 - Finding contacts of those with a reportable disease
- **Implementing maternal and child health; injury prevention; chronic disease control programs.**
- **Assessing the availability of health-related services and health care providers in local communities.**
- **Maintaining a competent workforce including: registered nurse, health education specialist, licensed environmental health scientist, and epidemiologist.**
- **Providing access to birth and death certificates.**
