- 517 (a) the number of cases opened in the state during the preceding fiscal year that involve
- 518 a domestic violence offense;
- (b) for each case described in Subsection (6)(a), the section under which the offender was charged or convicted;
- 519 {(b)}(c) the number of court orders in cases described in Subsection (6)(a) that require the
- 520 defendant to participate in an electronic or another type of monitoring program; and
- 521 $\{(c)\}$ (d) for each order described in Subsection (6) $\{(b)\}$ (c), whether the order was made under
- 522 <u>Section 77-20-3.5, 77-36-2.6, or 77-36-5, or another provision of state law.</u>
