89 (3) Subject to appropriations from the Legislature, and subject to the approval of the talent ready board, the state board shall distribute to

90 <u>local education agencies money appropriated for the grant program in accordance with this section</u>

92 (4) The { talent ready } state board shall:

93 (a) solicit applications from local education agency boards to receive grant money

94 under the grant program; { and }

95 (b) make recommendations to the {state} talent ready board regarding the awarding of grant money to

96 a local education agency board on behalf of a local education agency based on the criteria

- 64 [(B)] (ii) stress personal skills that encourage individual choice of abstinence and
