Intent Language

Minimum School Program - Basic School Program

- 1. The Legislature intends that the State Board of Education study the Necessarily Existent Small Schools distribution formula, including the recalculation of the regression formulas used to distribute program weighted pupil units, ways to address the unique needs of geographically isolated schools, school size limits identified in statute, and school qualification requirements and report to the Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee with a progress update by October 31, 2019 and a final report by October 31, 2020.
- 2. The Legislature intends that the State Board of Education in conjunction with the local education agencies (LEA) report per pupil expenditures on operations as defined by State Board of Education for each LEA and each school within the LEA in FY 2019 and report to the Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee by January 31, 2020.

Minimum School Program - Related to Basic School Programs

- 3. The Legislature intends that the State Board of Education use up to \$400,000 in nonlapsing balances in the Minimum School Program Related to Basic School Program to implement an online reporting platform for student transportation data.
- 4. The Legislature intends that the State Board of Education use up to \$445,800 in nonlapsing balances in the Minimum School Program Related to Basic School Program, Charter School Administration and Charter School Local Replacement programs to provide a minimum Administrative Cost funding base of \$40,000 for charter schools that enroll fewer than 400 students.
- 5. The Legislature intends that the State Board of Education distribute \$4.0 million appropriated to the Minimum School Program Charter School Local Replacement program to address the 2-year data lag to charter schools in FY 2020 using a formula that distributes funding on an equal per student basis.

State Board of Education - Initiative Programs

- 6. The Legislature intends that the State Board of Education not distribute grants provided through the Utah Computer Science for Utah Grant Program to local education agencies until private matching funds have been received by the State.
- 7. The Legislature intends that the State Board of Education study the state funding for the ProStart culinary arts program including, the appropriate level of ongoing state financial support, the potential of requiring a local match for participation in the program, and how the program fits into the broader framework of Career & Technical Education programs in the culinary arts and report to the Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee by October 31, 2019.

State Board of Education - State Administrative Office

8. The Legislature intends that the State Board of Education study the governance, funding, and role of the State Board of Education in providing oversight and coordinating the delivery of state education programs in the Regional Service Centers and report to the Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee by October 31, 2019.

State Board of Education - General System Support

9. The Legislature intends that the State Board of Education use \$350,000 ongoing from the Education Fund appropriated to Career & Technical Education to implement a short-term, 1-5 year, grant program for high schools that qualify as a Necessarily Existent Small School to develop or expand CTE career pathways.

Intent Language

State Board of Education - Utah Schools for the Deaf and the Blind

10. The Legislature intends that the State Board of Education use up to \$132,000 of the \$1,724,300 appropriated for the "LEA Opt-Out Funding for USDB" item to purchase up to four vehicles through the Utah Division of Fleet Operations.

Subject: Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee Actions

The Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee (subcommittee) requests certain statutory changes to fully implement our budget recommendations. Statutory changes are commonly included in the Public Education Budget Amendments bill (House Bill 2, 2019 General Session) to connect statute changes with funding formula changes or budget policies approved by the Legislature.

A. Enhancement for At-Risk Students

In a review of the Enhancement for At-Risk Students, the subcommittee discovered that formula changes made during the 2018 General Session to calculate enrollment growth do not work as intended. The subcommittee recommends amending Section 53F-2-410 to change the growth calculation from "shall increase annually with growth in the at-risk student population" to "the higher of a) general student growth, or b) the average of student growth in the three highest at-risk student categories."

B. Pupil Transportation – Guarantee Transportation Program

The subcommittee recommends converting the current Guarantee Transportation program in Section 53F-2-403 into a matching grant program for rural school districts. This change will clear up program inconsistencies from when it guaranteed property tax revenue. The subcommittee recommends that statutory language limit funding to school districts in counties of the 4th through 6th class, require a dedicated property tax match from the Board Local Levy, restrict program expenditures to non-To & From School transportation, and distribute funding proportional to prior-year non-To & From transportation miles and minutes.

C. Pupil Transportation – Rural School Reimbursement

The State Board of Education highlighted an issue found during the first-year implementation of the Rural School Reimbursement program in <u>Section 53F-5-211</u>. The current language establishes qualification at the school level, however the Board reports that they only collect transportation data at the local education agency (LEA) level. The subcommittee approved adjusting the statute to fix the issue identified by the Board.

D. Charter School Administration

The subcommittee approved intent language authorizing the State Board of Education to use up to \$445,800 in nonlapsing balances from the Minimum School Program – Related to Basic School Program to provide a funding base of \$40,000 for small charter schools enrolling fewer than 400 students.

Section 53F-2-306 limits the distribution of funding to \$100 per student. The subcommittee approved amending the statute to provide this base level of funding.
