Page 1, Lines 12 through 14:

Page 1, Line 27 through Page 2, Line 31:

(1) As used in this section, "{ owner } cohabitant" means { any } any individual 18 years of age or older 27 residing in the

28 <u>home who {-has an ownership interest in a firearm in the home }:</u>

(a) is living as if a spouse of the owner cohabitant;

(b) is related by blood or marriage to the owner cohabitant;

(c) has one or more children in common with the owner cohabitant; or

(d) has an interest in the safety and wellbeing of the owner cohabitant .

[(1)] (2) (a) { An owner } A cohabitant may voluntarily commit a firearm to a law

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enforcement agency for safekeeping if the {-owner-} cohabitant believes that the owner cohabitant 30

or another cohabitant with access to the firearm is an immediate threat to:

Page 2, Lines 39 through 46:

- 39 (2) Unless a firearm is an illegal firearm subject to Section 53-5c-202, a law
- 40 enforcement agency that receives a firearm in accordance with this chapter shall:
