243 (2) A practitioner may dispense methadone at an opioid treatment program regardless

244 of whether the practitioner is licensed to dispense methadone under this chapter if the practitioner:

245 (a) {the practitioner} is operating under the direction of a {pharmacist; and} physician;

(b) dispenses the methadone under the direction of a pharmacist; and

246 {(b)} (c) acts in accordance with division rule.

247 (3) The division shall, in consultation with pharmacies, physicians, and practitioners
