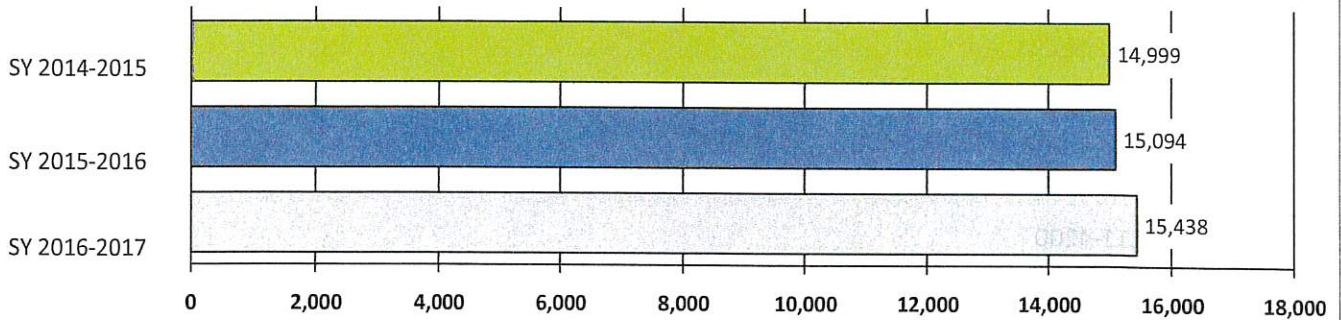

Note: Includes all enrolled homeless children and youth in grades PK through 12.

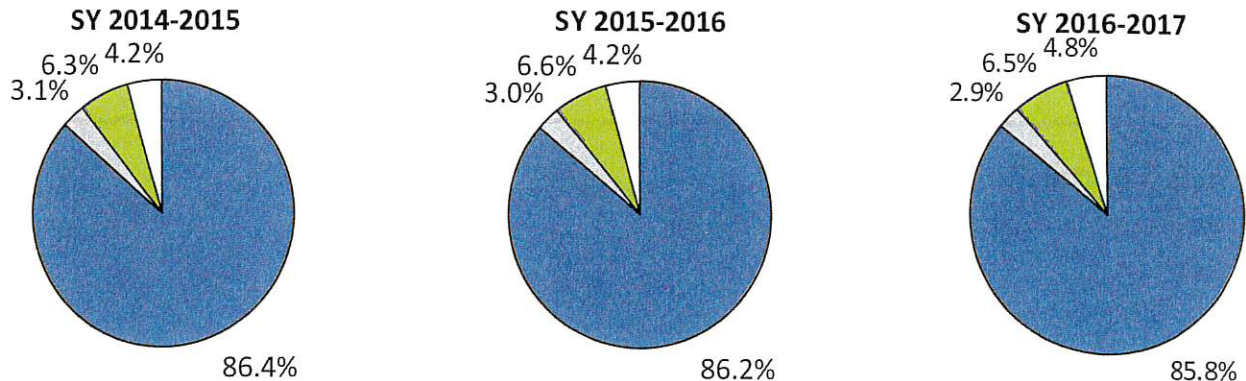

Migratory children/youth	0	65	58
Unaccompanied homeless youth	1,862	2,039	2,209
Children with disabilities (IDEA)	2,934	3,120	3,122
Limited English Proficient (LEP) students	2,412	2,478	2,904
