State budget:	There is an expected annual cost of \$435,800,000, in which up to 90,000 individuals may become eligible for Adult Medicaid coverage. This fiscal analysis also applies to the companion filings for Rules R414-303 and R414-311.		
Local government:	There is no impact on local governments because they neither fund nor provide services under the Medicaid program. This fiscal analysis also applies to the companion filings for Rules R414-303 and R414-311.
