


1. Statistics

Based on 2007 Rape in Utah Survey by Utah Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice unless otherwise indicated



Utah women interviewed


Almost 1/3 of Utah women

2. Intoxication

Intoxication in sexual assault

In Utah's 2007 survey, 41 said they were given drugs/alcohol without their knowledge

Utah law includes a section that says drugging a victim eliminates consent (76-5-406(2)(h))

Almost twice as many (81) said they were sexually assaulted after voluntary consumption



48 states and territories explicitly address intoxication and consent in statute



3. Proposal

Proposal

• Utah should add voluntary intoxication to the list of circumstances that aren't consensual

• 76-5-406(2)(m) the victim is incapable of consent by reason of drugs or alcohol and such condition is known or should have reasonably been known to the defendant.





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
