H.B. 10 – Boards and Commissions Amendments (<i>Roberts</i>)	None – Review not required				
H.B. 15 – Labor Commission Amendments (<i>Dunnigan</i>)	Adds 1 Senator and 1 Representative (appointed by the President and Speaker, respectively) to the Workers' Compensation Advisory Board as nonvoting members	Enactment of this legislation could increase expenditures by the Legislature by \$3,200 annually for the per diem expenses of an additional Workers' Compensation Advisory Council member from the House of Representatives and another from the Senate attending an expected four yearly meetings.	Not staffed by Legislative staff	None	
H.B. 116 – Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women, Girls, and LGBTQ+ Task Force (<i>Romero</i>)	Creates 15-member task force, including 3 Senators and 3 Representatives, and the remaining members appointed jointly by the President and Speaker Substitute bill modifies membership, adding two additional non-legislative members	Enactment of this legislation appropriates \$20,000 to the Senate and \$20,000 to the House of Representatives, from the General Fund one-time in FY 2021, for compensation of legislative members of the newly created task force. In addition, enactment of this legislation could cost the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel \$12,000 from the General Fund one-time in FY 2021 for per diem and travel expenses of non-legislative members of the task force. Substitute bill modifies the fiscal note: Enactment of this legislation appropriates \$14,000 to the Senate, \$14,000 to the House of Representatives, and \$12,000 to the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel, from the General Fund one-time in FY 2021, for compensation, per diem, and travel reimbursement of members of the newly created task force. S.B. 13 – Native American Legislative Liaison Committee Amendments (<i>Iwamoto</i>)	Increases House and Senate Membership – from 5 to 7 in House, from 3 to 4 in Senate.	Enactment of this legislation could cost the Legislature \$2,400 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2021 for compensation of members of the Native American Legislative Liaison Committee. Costs are broken down as follows: \$800 in the Senate, \$1,600 in the House of Representatives.	Currently staffed by LRGC	Bill repeals sunset date	Recommended by NALLC.
S.B. 30 – Economic Development Sunset Amendments (<i>McCay</i>)	Reinstates the Economic Development Legislative Liaison Committee that was previously repealed. 8 members, 4 each from both the House and Senate.	Committee members may receive compensation and expenses, but fiscal note indicates no material impact to state revenues or expenditures.	Jointly by LRGC and LFA	Repeals sunset of Utah State Fair Corporation Board of Directors (Senate and House would continue to appoint members) Repeals sunset provisions of Pete Suazo Utah Athletic Commission (President and Speaker would continue to appoint members)	Provides that the Economic Development Legislative Liaison Committee is not a public body for purposes of Open and Public Meetings.
S.B. 96 – Emerging Technology Talent Initiative (<i>Millner</i>)	Creates Deep Technology Talent Advisory Council, which includes 2 non-legislative members appointed by President, 2 non-legislative members appointed by Speaker, 1 Senator, and 1 Representative.	Fiscal note pending, members may not receive compensation or benefits for service.	State Board of Regents	None	State board reports to the Education Interim Committee and Higher Education Appropriations Subcommittee by November 1 of each year.
