WHAT TO DO WHEN SOMEBODY ALREADY IN PRISON COMMITS ANOTHER SERIOUS CRIME?



OR

HOW AGGRAVATED ASSAULT BECAME MORE SERIOUS THAN AGGRAVATED ASSAULT BY A PRISONER



76-3-203.6 Enhanced penalty for certain offenses committed by prisoners

Only applies to adult prisoners serving a sentence for a capital felony or a first degree felony.



76-3-203.6 Enhanced penalty for certain offenses committed by prisoners

If a prisoner commits a listed crime, the sentence is:

- Life Without the possibility of Parole (LWOP), or
- 20 years to life (only if the judge finds it would serve the interests of justice and states why on the record)

Agg Assault & Agg Assault by a Prisoner

Aggravated Assault

Aggravated Assault by a Prisoner

At least Third Degree Felony

At least Second Degree Felony

Second Degree Felony if result is serious bodily injury/loss of consciousness

First Degree Felony if serious bodily injury was intentionally caused



Agg Assault & Agg Assault by a Prisoner

- At a glance, it appears that Aggravated Assault by a Prisoner is the more serious offense;
- But for prisoners serving on a first or capital felony, the severity flips because Aggravated Assault by a Prisoner does not have the mandatory enhanced sentence.



• Amend the list of offenses by removing "Aggravated Assault" and inserting "Aggravated Assault by a Prisoner."
