

## **SB 145 Pharmacy Practice Amendments**

- Amends definitions: 65-118, 303-354, 418-430
- Having completed the training programs, an adult may administer epinephrine to a patient experiencing anaphylaxis or albuterol in the event of an asthma attack: 130-140
- Pharmacies can alter a prescription quantity if the prescribed packaging is unavailable and the change is in the best interest of the patient: 180-187
- Albuterol products can be interchanged if deemed appropriate: 198-199
- Increases the amount of a non-controlled substance that can be prescribed in an emergency: 269-289
- Authorizes the dispensing of certain prescription medical devices without a prescription: 291-298
- Authorizes a dispensing medical practitioner to dispense a labeled, pre-packaged seven-days' supply of HIV post-exposure prophylaxis to a patient at a rape crisis center: 383-386
- Authorizes the dispensing of epinephrine auto-injectors and stock albuterol by a pharmacist or pharmacy intern under a standing prescription drug order by a physician: 438-461
- Authorizes a physician to issue a standing prescription drug order for an epinephrine auto-injector or stock albuterol in accordance with a protocol that meets certain requirements: 465-500
- Exempts a physician from liability for civil damages for acts or omissions resulting from the dispensing of an epinephrine auto-injector or stock albuterol under the physician's standing prescription drug order: 518-524
- Exempts controlled substances dispensed for administration or use in a health care facility outpatient setting from reporting to the state's controlled substance database: 593-605
