1. Page 3, Lines 57 through 61:

57 (4) An individual is guilty of a second degree felony if the individual:

(a) cohabitates with another individual with whom the individual is engaged in bigamy

59 as described in Subsection (1); and

60 (b) in furtherance of the conduct described in Subsection (4)(a), commits a felony

61 offense, or for Subsection (4)(b)(vii), a misdemeanor offense, in violation of one or more of the following:
