- defines terms: 173-209, 227-312, 852-1050, 3265-3280, 4325-4328
- amends certain dosage form requirements for cannabinoid products: 195
- allows for the use of cannabidiol from outside the state in certain circumstances: 218-224
- provides for cannabis cultivation facilities rather than cannabis processing facilities to acquire cannabis from industrial hemp cultivators and processors: 229-234
- requires licensing agencies to give preference to certain abilities among license applicants; 481-482, 650-652, 2133-2134, 2239-2240
- allows certain medical providers to access the electronic verification system regarding a patient the provider treats; 1158-1168
- amends proximity requirements regarding community locations: 262-264 and 872-874
- amends provisions regarding access to an inventory control system by certain financial institutions that the Division of Finance validates: 325-326 and 337-356
- allows the Utah Department of Agriculture and Food (UDAF) to grant a partial-year limited license to operate as a cannabis processing facility in certain circumstances: 4433-447
- increases the ability of UDAF to revoke a cannabis production establishment license: 483-500
- allows for UDAF to operate an independent cannabis testing laboratory: 519-532
- clarifies provisions regarding license renewal: 535-538
- allows a cannabis cultivation facility to operate using up to two locations: 390-391, 550-552, and 600-604
- allows for the use of stacking plants within allotted square footage limitations: 265-268, 574-578
- allows for a cannabis production establishment to hold educational events under certain circumstances and in accordance with UDAF rules: 673-697
- allows an individual without a state cannabis-related license to transport medical cannabis devices in certain circumstances: 748-750
- amends provisions regarding flavoring of cannabis products: 804-805
- allows the Cannabinoid Product Board to review a broader category of scientific research: 817-819
- clarifies legal dosage limits: 899-906
- amends the directions of use and dosing guidelines that may be associated with a medical cannabis recommendation: 884-888
- amends the medicinal dosage form for unprocessed cannabis flower, 972-1009
- amends provisions regarding access to the electronic verification system by law enforcement and certain medical staff: 11131-1134 and 1138-1147
- amends provisions regarding the obtaining and renewing of medical cannabis cards: 1086-1093
- reduces the degree required for the professional who diagnoses or confirms post-traumatic stress disorder as a qualifying condition: 1240-1241
- requires the Compassionate Use Board to review recommendations for the use of medical cannabis devices by patients under a certain age to vaporize medical cannabis 1315-1318
- provides for an expedited petition process from the Compassionate Use Board to the Department of Health (DoH): 1333-1341



- exempts the Compassionate Use Board from certain compensation restrictions: 1289-1294
- amends the patient limits on qualified medical providers and the specializations which allow qualified medical providers to recommend medical cannabis to a larger patient population: 1447-1460
- amends provisions regarding medical professionals advertising regarding medical cannabis: 1481-1495
- provides certain immunity from liability for employees and agents of healthcare facilities in certain circumstances; 1557-1577
- provides protections for state or political subdivisions employees using medical cannabis: 1592-1596
- provides that private employers are not required to accommodate the use of medical cannabis: 1630-1632
- Amends provisions regarding designated caregivers for certain minors and patients in certain health care facilities: 1701-1706 and 1879-1894
- directs DoH to establish a registration process that would allow out-of-state patients visiting the state to purchase medical cannabis within the state under certain conditions: 1833-1842
- amends certain criminal penalties, including for certain nonresident patients, to be infractions on a first offense: 1992-2038 and 3377-3385
- increases the ability of DoH to revoke a medical cannabis pharmacy license: 2135-2152
- amends requirements for pharmacist counseling or consultation based on the directions of use and dosing guidelines that may accompany a medical cannabis recommendation: 884-888 and 2422-2454
- allows a medical cannabis pharmacy to purchase medical cannabis devices from a seller that does not have a state cannabis-related license: 2287-2289
- allow UDAF to conduct random sampling of medical cannabis in medical cannabis pharmacies: 2306-2308
- amends provisions regarding medical cannabis pharmacy advertising, including allowing a medical cannabis pharmacy to hold educational events under certain circumstances and in accordance with DoH rules: 2559-2582
- amends provisions regarding the transportation of medical cannabis and medical cannabis devices: 700-750 and 2585-2631
- prohibits a municipality or county that imposes certain restrictions on a medical cannabis pharmacy from restricting operations within certain hours; 2659-2660
- allows for the state central patient portal to facilitate electronic medical cannabis orders for an individual to obtain in person at a medical cannabis pharmacy: 2688-2692
- allows a pharmacy medical provider to transport medical cannabis in certain circumstances: 2590
- provides that meetings of the Compassionate Use Board are closed meetings: 2981-2983
- amends the definition of marijuana: 3179-3203
- creates a rebuttable presumption for cannabidiol use in certain circumstances: 3330-3340
- exempts cannabis metabolite from a driving-related crime in certain circumstances: 2791-2797

- adds a cannabis-based drug to the Controlled Substances Act: 3823
- amends the level of negligence required for certain marijuana-related vehicular injuries to constitute a felony: 4030-4045
- distinguishes medical cannabis devices from electronic cigarettes: 4325-4328
- exempts a lawful medical cannabis user from a weapons restriction: 4368-4370
- provides for expungement of cannabis-related convictions in certain circumstances: 4390-4397 and 4504-4510
