The following statutes are scheduled for repeal unless reauthorized by the Legislature:

- [Utah Code Title 63M, Chapter 11](#), Utah Commission on Aging (July 1, 2021)

The committee will receive a brief introduction to each statute scheduled for repeal. At future meetings, the committee will review each statute further and determine whether to recommend its reauthorization, with or without amendments.
