What Have We Done to Date

- In 2016 passed SB 115-STEP RMP EV Incentives
- Coupled with DOE Funding and VW Settlement
- Partnered with DEQ, UDOT, Maverik, Electrify America



- Installed over 60 DC Fast Chargers
- Installed over 1,600 Level 2 Chargers throughout the state

Utah Leading the Way

On July 16, 2020 the Department of Energy awarded RMP two separate grants

- 1) \$6.6 million award to create an enduring regional electric vehicle ecosystem across the West and sustain accelerated growth in freight, business and consumer use of electric vehicles; including at the Inland Port.
- 2) \$5 million award for Utility Managed Smart Charging in partnership with ABB Ltd, to develop next-generation technology to help integrate electric vehicles into the grid.

On August 4, 2020 National Science Foundation Awarded Utah State University \$50 million.

To create ASPIRE, a leading research center in Electrified Transportation



Implementing HB 396

- Continue coordinating with UDOT and other partners and key stakeholders
- Hold public workshop in September to solicit input
- Submit Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Program for Public Service Commission approval by the end of the year
- Begin construction late spring/early summer in 2021
