	As used in this part:
	(1) "Active task force" means a task force placed at the direction, control, and funding
of th	e division, in accordance with an agreement entered into under this section, in response to,
<u>or in</u>	anticipation of a disaster or emergency.

34	(3) "Sponsoring agency" means a political subdivision that executes a memorandum of
35	understanding with the United States Department of Homeland Security to organize a task

46	(1) (a) The division may enter into an agreement with a sponsoring agency to establish
47	terms and conditions that apply if a task force organized by the sponsoring agency becomes an
48	active task force.
49	(b) If the division enters into an agreement described in Subsection (1)(a), the
50	agreement may allow the division to reimburse the sponsoring agency for:
51	(i) costs related to the operation of an active task force, as allowed under 44 C.F.R.
52	Part 208, at the rates provided under 44 C.F.R. Part 208;
53	(ii) payment for death, disability, or injury of an individual if the individual suffers
54	death, disability, or injury in the course of performing the individual's duties for the active task
