November 19, 2020

Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control

Heard a <u>presentation</u> from the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control about its internal policies related to the sale of alcoholic beverages and customer identification.

Department of Health

Heard a presentation from the Department of Health about:

- data <u>sharing agreements</u> with the Utah Population Database, part of the Huntsman Cancer Institute and University of Utah, and data privacy issues; and
- the <u>department's processes</u> for determining causes of death and reporting deaths, including <u>COVID-19</u> <u>deaths</u>.

Business and Labor

November 17, 2020

Apprenticeship Utilization Requirements

Discussed 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Apprenticeship Utilization Requirements," which would:

- require a specified amount of labor be performed by an apprentice for certain public works projects;
- establish other requirements for a contract between a government entity and a contractor relating to labor provided by an apprentice; and
- provide exceptions to the apprentice labor requirement under certain circumstances.

Board of Financial Institutions Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Board of Financial Institutions Amendments," which would extend the sunset date for the Board of Financial Institutions from July 1, 2021, to July 1, 2031.

Commercial Interior Designers Act Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Commercial Interior Designers Act Amendments," which would remove the repeal date of the State Certification of Commercial Interior Designers Act.

Competency-based Licensing

Received a <u>presentation</u> from Vametric, Inc., about competency-based evidence tools for occupational licensing and how competency-based assessments are helping COVID-19 economic recovery by using demonstratable abilities and skills rather than exams.

Condominium and Community Association Regulation Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Condominium and Community Association Regulation Amendments," which would prevent a condominium or homeowners association from prohibiting a condominium unit or lot owner from installing a personal security camera on the owner's unit or a structure on the owner's lot.

Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control Funding Mechanism

Discussed potential policies regarding the funding mechanisms for the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control that would amend what is included in the department's base budget.

Employee Status Amendments

Received a summary <u>document</u> from Stephenson Consulting that lists the benefits of establishing, under certain conditions, that a remote-service contractor is not an employee of a marketplace company.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Employee Status Amendments," which would provide that a remoteservice contractor is not an employee of a marketplace company if certain conditions are met.

Government Insurance Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Government Insurance Amendments," which would authorize the State Risk Manager to create one or more captive insurance companies.

Insurance Revisions

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Insurance Revisions," which would amend many items throughout the Insurance Code.

Physician Assistant Act Amendments

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Utah Academy of Physician Assistants about the supervising physician assistant model, direct billing, and regulation.

Also heard from the Utah Psychological Association and Utah Medical Association.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Physician Assistant Act Amendments," which would amend the scope of practice for physician assistants and would authorize physician assistants and their employers to be eligible for direct payment by all public and private insurers.

Physician Assistant Mental Health Practice Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Physician Assistant Mental Health Practice Amendments," which would allow a physician assistant to specialize in psychiatric mental health and would define the requirements and scope of practice for this specialization.

Post-employment Restrictions Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Post-employment Restrictions Amendments," which would modify the permissible scope of a post-employment restrictive covenant by prohibiting an employer and an employee from entering into a post-employment restrictive covenant that is broader than necessary to protect the legitimate business interests of the employer or that applies to a geographic area that is larger than the geographic area in which the employer has significant presence or influence.

Required Reports

Received the following required written reports:

- Beer Availability Workgroup Annual Report; and
- Report of the Commissioner of Financial Institutions.

Residential Mortgage Regulatory Commission Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Residential Mortgage Regulatory Commission Amendments," which would extend the sunset date for the Residential Mortgage Regulatory Commission from July 1, 2021, to July 1, 2031.

Criminal Code Evaluation Task Force

October 26, 2020

Affirmative Consent

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the S.J. Quinney College of Law at the University of Utah and the Brigham Young University College of Nursing regarding issues related to affirmative consent as they relate to the criminal code.

Building Regulation Violations

Received comments from the Utah Home Builders Association and Ivory Homes regarding building regulation violations as they relate to the criminal code.

Action: Voted to open a task force bill file to address recommended statutory changes, including the possibility of reducing certain criminal building code violations to civil penalties.

Electronic Harassment

Received an update from the Attorney General's Office regarding whether amendments to the electronic harassment statute implemented within the last three to four years have placed the statute in line with current and emerging technologies.

Peace Officer Training Qualifications

Discussed 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Peace Officer Training Qualifications Amendments," which would remove the requirement that an applicant for peace officer training programs must be a United States citizen.

Action: Voted to prioritize 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Peace Officer Training Qualifications," and bring it back before the task force for further consideration.

Stalking

Discussed 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Stalking Amendments," which changes the definition of "course of conduct" required for the offense of stalking by increasing the number of acts necessary to constitute a course of conduct and requiring that the acts constituting the course of conduct evidence a continuity of purpose.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Stalking Amendments."

Economic Development and Workforce Services

November 17, 2020

Child Care Advisory Committee Sunset Extension

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Child Care Advisory Committee Sunset Extension," which would extend the sunset dates related to the Child Care Advisory Committee to July 1, 2026.

Emergency Procurement Declaration Modifications

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Emergency Procurement Declaration Modifications," which would modify reporting requirements related to an emergency procurement and limit the term length of a contract entered into for an emergency procurement.

Hotel Impact Mitigation Fund Sunset Extension

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Hotel Impact Mitigation Fund Sunset Extension," which would extend the sunset date of the Hotel Impact Mitigation Fund, which is part of the New Convention Facility Development Incentives to July 1, 2028.

Public Infrastructure District Revisions

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Public Infrastructure District Revisions," which would renumber provisions related to public infrastructure districts.

Rural Online Initiative Sunset Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Rural Online Initiative Sunset Amendments," which would remove the sunset date of the Rural Online Initiative program and modify the program's reporting requirements.

State Flag Task Force

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "State Flag Task Force," which would create the State Flag Task Force and provide the task force's duties regarding the proposal of a new state flag of Utah.





Economic Development

Received a presentation from two legislators and the Governor-elect regarding a proposed strategic focus for future legislative changes related to economic development in the state.

Intergenerational Poverty Mitigation Act Amendments

Discussed draft legislation, "Intergenerational Poverty Mitigation Act Amendments," which would amend the memberships of the Utah Intergenerational Welfare Reform Commission and the Intergenerational Poverty Advisory Committee. Heard from the Department of the Workforce Services, explaining the need for the draft legislation.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Intergenerational Poverty Mitigation Act Amendments."

Workforce Solutions for Improved Air Quality

Received a <u>report</u> from the Department of Human Resource Management (DHRM) on the results of three surveys related to teleworking by the state's workforce. The surveys asked:

- executive department and agency leaders about how many jobs require an assigned workspace and why;
- supervisors about the overall productivity impact of teleworking; and
- employees currently teleworking about their teleworking experience.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Workforce Solutions for Air Quality Amendments," which would enact reporting and other requirements for DHRM related to teleworking by state employees.

Education

Impacts of COVID-19 on Public Education: Assessment and Accountability

Heard a <u>presentation</u> from the State Board of Education about the programs affected by waivers granted by the Legislature in 2020 Third Special Session S.B. 3005, "<u>Education Modifications</u>," for certain public education assessment requirements and other assessment and accountability issues affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Public Education Reporting Requirements

Discussed 2021 General Session draft legislation,
"Education Agency Report Process Amendments," and
proposed modifications. The draft legislation would remove
some reporting requirements from statute and require the
State Board of Education (state board) to establish a policy
or procedure to evaluate the impact any report the state
board requires in rule may have on a local education
agency's reporting requirements.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Education Agency Report Process Amendments."

Transition to a Single Higher Education System

Heard a <u>presentation</u> from the Board of Higher Education about the process of transitioning the higher education and technical college systems to a single governance system, as directed in 2020 General Session S.B. 111, "Higher Education Amendments."

Federalism Commission

October 27, 2020

Chair Updates: GEOMANCER/AEON Federal Land Valuation Model Training Discussion

Discussed options for allocating the 50 licenses that the commission is authorized to grant for training and use of the Federal Land Valuation Model. Heard from Utah Association of Counties on the benefits to counties from utilizing the tool and requesting the commission consider granting licenses to certain counties.

Federal Land Valuation Model and Greenbelt Valuations

Discussed a concern with evaluating greenbelt properties higher than the current standard, resulting in higher property taxes for property owners. Heard from the director of the Property Tax Division, State Tax Commission, who explained the process for evaluating greenbelt properties, addressed the impacts Geomancer's land valuation model would have on property taxes, and answered commission questions.

Action: Voted to open a committee resolution to communicate the commission's intent to hold Greenbelt valuations harmless.

PILT and Allocating Funds

Discussed certain county concerns regarding the Payments in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) distribution formula and a floor for current county revenues.

Action: Voted to open a bill file to show legislative intent for a funding floor consistent with current revenues counties receive.

Procurement of Services for Development of Land Management Plans and for Policy Advocacy

Heard from two legislators about the <u>evaluation committee</u> <u>report</u> for the Request for Proposals (RFP) for Consulting Service for the Development of Land Management Plans and the evaluation committee report for the RFP for Policy Advocacy Services. Discussed the backgrounds of the proposals and the recommendations in the reports.

Action: Voted to accept the Davalier Group's proposal for the Policy Advocacy Consulting Services.



Action: Voted to accept the Sunrise Engineering proposal for the Consulting Services for the Development of Land Management Plans.

Government Operations

November 17, 2020

Behavioral Emergency Services Amendments

Discussed 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Behavioral Emergency Services Amendments," which would create a new license for behavioral emergency services technicians and advanced behavioral emergency services technicians.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Behavioral Emergency Services Amendments."

Competency-based Hiring Amendments

Discussed 2021 General Session "Competency-based Hiring Amendments," which would address the consideration of experience or abilities for certain job applicants.



Department of Human Services Budgetary Procedures Amendments

Discussed 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Department of Human Services Budgetary Procedures Amendments," which would allow the executive director of the Department of Human Services to designate up to three priority programs within the department to receive funds from other department programs that the department determines have unexpended funds from the fiscal year in which the funds were appropriated.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Department of Human Services Budgetary Procedures Amendments."

Governmental Use of Facial Recognition Technology

Discussed draft legislation, "Governmental Use of Facial Recognition Technology," which would address the state's use of facial recognition technology.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Governmental Use of Facial Recognition Technology."

Group Gang Enhancement Amendments

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Utah Sentencing Commission, and discussed draft legislation, "<u>Group Gang Enhancement Amendments</u>," which would modify the sentencing enhancements and applicable offenses for certain crimes committed in concert with multiple people or on behalf of criminal street gangs.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Group Gang Enhancement Amendments."

Juvenile Offender Penalty Amendments

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Utah Sentencing Commission, and discussed 2021 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Juvenile Offender Penalty Amendments</u>," which would address penalties imposed on an individual for certain sexual offenses committed as a juvenile.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Juvenile Offender Penalty Amendments."

Mental Health Crisis Intervention Council

Discussed 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Mental Health Crisis Intervention Council" which would create the Mental Health Crisis Intervention Council to establish protocols and standards for the training and functioning of local mental health crisis intervention teams.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Mental Health Crisis Intervention Council."

Mobile Voting Pilot Project

Discussed 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Mobile Voting Pilot Project," which would allow a municipality to choose to permit a voter to vote by electronic means approved by the municipality's election officer.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Mobile Voting Pilot Project."

Voter Referendum Amendments

Discussed 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Voter Referendum Amendments," which would clarify the definition of a land use law and modify the elections at which a referendum relating to legislative action taken after April 15 may appear on the ballot.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Voter Referendum Amendments."

Health and Human Services

COVID-19

Briefed by the Department of Health on issues related to the COVID-19 pandemic, including incidence of the disease, hospital capacity, steps to promote safety during the Thanksgiving holiday, testing, and potential features of the next public health order.

Delegation of Health Care Services

Briefed by the Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing on the implementation of 2020 General Session H.B. 274, "Delegation of Health Care Services Amendments," which required the division "in consultation with the Department of Health, [to] identify by rule...a list of health care services that an unlicensed individual may perform without delegation by a health care provider..., regardless of the setting or licensing of the facility in which the health care services are performed."

Medicaid: Accountable Care Organizations

Considered 2021 General Session draft resolution, "Joint Resolution Recognizing the Success of the Utah Medicaid Accountable Care Program," which would recognize the success of the state's Medicaid accountable care program.

Action: Approved as a committee resolution draft legislation, "Joint Resolution Recognizing the Success of the Utah Medicaid Accountable Care Program."

Medical Cannabis

Briefed by the Cannabinoid Product Board (CPB) and the Compassionate Use Board (CUB). The CPB reported that it has published comprehensive, condition-specific, evidence-based guidance for use of medical cannabis and supports efforts to improve patient access and safety by including medical cannabis in the state's controlled substance database. The CUB reported that since March 2020 it has approved 106 requests for use of medical cannabis, 87% of which have been for individuals 11 to 20 years of age and 58% of which have been for chronic pain or post-traumatic stress disorder.

Also <u>briefed</u> by sponsors of medical cannabis legislation on issues likely to be addressed by a handful of cannabis bills during the 2021 General Session, including protection of consumers from predatory practices, reporting of dispensing information to the state's controlled substance database, delegation of certain tasks to dispensing pharmacies, and authorization of individuals who are not qualified medical providers to recommend medical cannabis.

Sunset Review: Kurt Oscarson Children's Organ Transplant Coordinating Committee

Considered draft legislation that postpones the sunset of the Kurt Oscarson Children's Organ Transplant Coordinating Committee for 10 years.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Kurt Oscarson Children's Organ Transplant Coordinating Committee Extension."



Telehealth: Interstate Services

Considered draft legislation that specifies that the diagnosis or treatment of a mental health condition using telehealth services qualifies for payment by a health insurer that offers catastrophic mental health coverage.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Mental Health Access Amendments."

Utah Marriage Commission

Considered draft legislation that moves the Utah Marriage Commission from the Department of Human Services to the Governor's Office, changes commission membership, and amends the marriage license fee used to fund the commission.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Marriage Commission Amendments."

Health Reform Task Force

November 12, 2020

Medicaid Waivers

<u>Briefed</u> by the Department of Health on the development of four Medicaid waiver requests required by 2020 legislation and the status of other waiver requests required by previous legislation. Requests required by 2020 legislation address coverage for:

- inmates;
- in vitro fertilization;
- services provided in a mental health facility; and
- certain crisis management services.

Medicaid: Eligibility Expansion

<u>Briefed</u> by the Department of Health on how Medicaid enrollment has been affected by recent eligibility expansions and how the COVID-19 pandemic has affected enrollment outreach efforts.

Medicaid: Preferred Drug List

Received a <u>progress report</u> from the Department of Health on its study of how adoption of a uniform preferred drug list for Medicaid accountable care organizations would impact state spending. The department plans to publish its report sometime before January 1, 2021.

Medical Respite Care: Individuals Experiencing Homelessness

Considered 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Medical Respite Care Pilot Program," which would require the Department of Health to request a federal Medicaid waiver that would permit payment for supportive medical services provided in short-term housing to certain individuals experiencing homelessness.

Action: Approved as a committee bill draft legislation, "Medical Respite Care Pilot Program."

Utah Health Insurance Markets: 2021 Premiums

Received a report from the Insurance Department on 2021 health insurance rates for the individual and small group markets. Rates in the individual market will be 1% lower overall than in 2020; rates in the small group market will be 3.9% higher overall than in 2020. The department recommended consideration of several potential state policy changes to:

- subsidize policy premiums for individuals with a household income greater than 400% of the federal poverty level;
- implement an Affordable Care Act 1332 waiver with a reinsurance component;
- replace the federal health insurance exchange with a state-based exchange; and
- use the state's all-payers claims database to analyze movement between exchange plans and Medicaid.

Received a <u>report</u> from the Utah Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice regarding the Justice Reinvestment Initiative and the Department of Corrections.

Grand Jury Amendments

Heard a <u>presentation</u> regarding 2021 General Session draft legislation "Grand Jury Amendments," which would:

- amend the requirements for calling a grand jury;
- change the procedure for disclosing facts, legal standards, and proceedings; and
- require a county or municipality to pay expenses in certain circumstances.

School Technology Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "School Technology Amendments," which would require digital resources provided in Utah public schools to block obscene or pornographic material.

November 17, 2020

24/7 Sobriety Program

Discussed additional elements related to the possible statewide expansion of the 24/7 sobriety program included in 2021 General Session draft legislation, "24/7 Sobriety Program Expansion."

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "24/7 Sobriety Program Expansion."

Asset Forfeiture

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Attorney General's Office providing an update on proposed changes to asset forfeiture in the state.

DUI Revisions

Received comments from Victim Services and the Cache County Attorney's Office regarding 2021 General Session draft legislation, "DUI Revisions," which would make changes to bail provisions for DUI offenses.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation "DUI Revisions."

Law Enforcement Internal Investigation Requirements

Received comments from the Utah Chiefs of Police Association and Peace Officer Standards and Training regarding 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Law Enforcement Internal Investigation Requirements," which would provide direction for investigations into officer misconduct if the officer leaves the department.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation "Law Enforcement Internal Investigation Requirements."

Medical Examiner Amendments

Discussed 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Medical Examiner Amendments," which would require the chief medical examiner to investigate deaths resulting directly from actions of a law enforcement officer.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Medical Examiner Amendments."

Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls Task Force

Received comments from the State Bureau of Investigation and Restoring Ancestral Winds regarding 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls Task Force,"which would extend the Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls Task Force until November 30, 2023.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls Task Force."





Police K-9 Certifications

Revenue and Taxation

November 18, 2020

Net Operating Loss

Considered 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Corporate Tax Amendments," which is related to the treatment of net operating losses for Utah corporate income tax purposes and allows a taxpayer to carry back, for up to three years, a Utah net loss realized during certain taxable years.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Corporate Tax Amendments."

Property Tax Relief

Considered two pieces of legislation related to property tax relief for seniors.

The first, 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Property Tax Relief Amendments," would expand the tax relief provisions known as "circuit breaker" by increasing the income threshold and limiting the types of income that count toward that threshold.

The second, 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Property Tax Deferral Modifications," would require a county to grant a property tax deferral to an owner of a single-family residence who is 66 years old or older and whose residence is valued at less than \$500,000 under certain circumstances.

Action: Approved as committee bills, 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Property Tax Relief Amendments," and 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Property Tax Deferral Modifications."

Required Annual Review of Certain Income Tax Credits

Received a summary <u>presentation</u> from the Legislative Fiscal Analyst's Office, and discussed the merits of the following two income tax credits with the Legislative Fiscal Analyst's Office and the Governor's Office of Economic Development:

- Motion Picture Incentives, <u>63N-8-101</u>; and
- Technology and Life Sciences Investment Tax Credit, 63N

 2-801.

Sections <u>59-7-159</u> and <u>59-10-137</u> require the Revenue and Taxation Interim Committee each year to review certain tax credits and make recommendations concerning whether the tax credits should be continued, modified, or repealed.

Tax Code Clarifications

Considered 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Tax Modifications," which would modify the tax code to clarify signature requirements, update tax credits to match current income tax rates, integrate special session legislation, and make technical corrections.

Tax Commission Garnishment Authority

Tax Credit Repeal

Considered 2021 General Session draft legislation, "Student Prosperity Savings Program Amendments," which would repeal income tax incentives related to the Student Prosperity Savings Program.
