1. Page 3, Lines 64 through 66:

requires a medical cannabis pharmacy to provide an opaque bag or box in which a medical

65 cannabis cardholder is required to keep a container of medical cannabis while

66 transporting the container in public;

2. Page 38, Lines 1156 through 1158:

1156 (B) at any time the medical cannabis cardholder transports or possesses the container in

public, is contained within an opaque[, child-resistant] bag or box that the medical cannabis pharmacy

1158 provides; and

3. Page 82, Line 2531 through Page 83, Line 2538:

2531 (C) provides an opaque bag or box for the medical cannabis cardholder's use in transporting

2532 the container in public; and

2533 [(d)] (v) for a product that is a cube that is designed for ingestion through chewing or

2534 holding in the mouth for slow dissolution, include a separate, off-label warning about the risks

2535 of over-consumption.

2536 (b) A medical cannabis cardholder transporting or possessing the container described

in Subsection (6)(a)(iv) in public shall keep the container within the opaque bag or box that the

2538 medical cannabis pharmacist provides.

1. Page 1, Lines 9 through 16:

- 9 This bill addresses recovery of Medicaid funds from { a parent whose child is injured in
- 10 foster care } certain third party obligors.
- 11 Highlighted Provisions:
- 12 This bill:
- 13 prohibits the Department of Health from recovering Medicaid funds from a { parent
- 14 whose child suffers certain injuries in foster care if the foster parent a third party is obligated to
- 15 pay for the injuries third party obligor that is required to pay for injuries to a child in foster care; and
- makes technical and conforming changes.
- 2. Page 3, Lines 59 through 64:
- 59 (c) The department may not recover medical assistance under Subsection (1)(a) if:
- 60 (i) the third party {-is a foster parent who } is obligated to pay the recipient for an injury to
- 61 the recipient's child that occurred while the child was in the { legal } physical custody of { the } a foster parent;
- 62 <u>and</u>
- 63 (ii) the child's injury is a physical or mental impairment that requires ongoing medical
