

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A letter from our CEO

2020 has been quite the year for education, technology, digital citizenship and the world. Like many others, this year found Digital Respons-Ability pivoting to online delivery models. We've worked with students and parents this year through a screen, rather than in a classroom.

While I am eager to get us back face-to-face with the students, this year has broadened our outreach of digital means to share our work, and share it we did. 2020 brought Digital Respons-Ability's first federal contract, educating teachers with our online professional development around the world. Digital delivery also meant we were able to gather hundreds of teens together for an exciting, first-ever Virtual Healthy Teens Summit. While we did not teach as many students and parents as we predicted in 2019, we were able to reach certain populations that would be difficult to talk to in person. Our website, free online resources, webinars and video resources reached those people we could not educate in person. We created a new website, digital-parenting.com that shared educational resources and advice for families adjusting to pandemic living. More importantly, the ability to work virtually kept our staff and others in our community safe.

There will be many books, theses and documentaries created about 2020 analyzing what changed, and what didn't. I can't predict the future; but like others working in educational technology, I feel fairly certain that virtual learning will grow, but it will increase alongside in-person education. 2020 taught us that the Internet can be a lifeline, but nothing replaces human contact. I look forward to 2021 and continuing to expand our work to create better digital humans--but in a real-life space.

SchoolTube



Online Educator Training

We created and curated curriculum to train educators on teaching digital citizenship in the classroom.

Our Online Educator Training is SCORM-compliant and compatible with any LMS. Taking this course can also be counted towards CEUs, with the option of getting a certificate of completion through Utah Valley University.

This curriculum was created, delivered in person and taught to Utah teachers, and then adapted for online. It utilizes our thousands of hours working with students and educators. It has also been **purchased by the United States Department of Defense** for use in their schools around the globe.

Free Monthly Webinars

When SARS-COVID-19 hit in the spring, we knew we needed to support educators and the community.

With budgets tighter and everything moving online, we knew that providing support for free could help spread encouragement and knowledge. One way we do this is through free webinars. On the second week of every month, we present a webinar on various topics. Recent webinars include the topics: Teacher Burnout, Digital Wellness, and Media Literacy.
