Deliverables 2 and 3 will formally serve as the record of analysis and studied work product with the intent of educating current and future members of the Utah Supreme Court and the Office, informing and guiding Office policy and development, and informing other jurisdictions how to best initiate, scale, and sustain legal sandboxes. Together, these three deliverables will advance the Utah Supreme Court's goal of developing a fully functional and mature system of empirical risk-based regulation for an open, competitive, and affordable legal services market in the state.
