- (1) If any area of the state is omitted from a Congressional district in the Congressional shapefile [enacted by the Legislature] in the possession of the lieutenant governor's office, the county clerk of the affected county, upon discovery of the omission, shall attach the area to the appropriate Congressional district according to the requirements of Subsections (2) and (3).
- (2) If the omitted area is surrounded by a single Congressional district, the county clerk shall attach the area to that district.
- (3) If the omitted area is contiguous to two or more Congressional districts, the county clerk shall attach the area to the district that has the least population, as determined by the Utah Population Committee.

159	(1) As used in this section, "affected party" means:
160	(a) a representative whose Congressional district boundary is uncertain because the
161	boundary in the Congressional shapefile used to establish the district boundary has been
162	removed, modified, or is unable to be identified or who is uncertain about whether the
163	representative or another individual resides in a particular Congressional district;
164	(b) a candidate for Congressional representative whose Congressional district boundary
165	is uncertain because the boundary in the Congressional shapefile used to establish the district
166	boundary has been removed, modified, or is unable to be identified or who is uncertain about
167	whether the candidate or another individual resides in a particular Congressional district; or
168	(c) an individual who is uncertain about which Congressional district contains the
169	individual's residence because the boundary in the Congressional shapefile used to establish the
170	district boundary has been removed, modified, or is unable to be identified.
171	(2) (a) An affected party may file a written request petitioning the lieutenant governor
172	to determine:
173	(i) the precise location of the Congressional district boundary;
174	(ii) the number of the Congressional district in which an individual resides; or
175	(iii) both Subsections (2)(a)(i) and (ii).
176	(b) In order to make the determination required by Subsection (2)(a), the lieutenant

201	Section 7. Effective date.
202	If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this bill takes effect
203	upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah
204	Constitution, Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto,
205	the date of veto override.
206	Section 8. Revisor instructions.
207	The Legislature intends that the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel, in
208	preparing the Utah Code database for publication, replace the references in Section
209	20Δ-13-101.5 from "this hill" to the hill's designated chanter number in the Laws of Utah
