	Description and Purpose of Grant:	Green infrastructure projects in financially disadvantaged communities within Utah. Green infrastructure projects will improved stormwater quality and water quality of the water bodies that are being discharged to. This will cause a reduction in the impacts of stormwater pollution from these areas. Increase use and success of green infrastructure projects will hopefully lead to a greater adoption of these type of stormwater controls across the State. DWQ prioritized the projects for OSG subgrants by selecting projects that are in financially disadvantaged communities as defined in the CWSRF Intended Use Plan. The Intended Use Plan state that to qualify as disadvantaged the estimated annual cost of sewer service for the average residential user must exceed 1.4% of the modified median adjusted gross income. DWQ plans to solicit project proposals as soon as a response is received from EPA on the grant application. It is expected that project proposals are received, scored, and awarded by spring 2022. Projects will be required to commence work within 18 months of being awarded and to be completed within 3 years. The solicitation will specifically request green infrastructure projects that meet green project reserve standards, require a 20% cost share from the applicant , and require them to be in a financially disadvantaged community. A preference will go to projects that are ready for construction to begin. This grant application is for the FFY20 and FFY21 allocation amounts.
