# <u>SOEP</u> Budget Overview and Expected Expenditures

The Statewide Online Education Program (SOEP) enables eligible private and home school students to earn high school graduation credit through the completion of public funded online courses. These students are funded through state appropriations made to the program. Beginning in FY 2022, the Legislature expanded the program to include home and private school students in 7-8th grade. The purpose of the SOEP is to provide high quality online learning opportunities to students regardless of where they attend school.
