

- Re-use Project was constructed by the City of St. Geroge in 2006 as part of a water rights settlement agreement.
- The Re-use Project consisted of the re-use plant, 15 miles of 24" diameter pipeline, three (3) booster pump stations, and two reservoir sites.
- The environmental work was completed in 2003, and a BLM Grant for the Graveyard Wash Reservoir was secured in 2004.
- Re-use plant produces Type I Reuse Water and has a current Plant Capacity of 7 MGD -10.5 MGD with 3rd filter bay equipped.
- 7,800 AF 11,750 AF Capacity.

- ~2,100 acre-ft reservoir
- Existing 24-inch and 30inch dia. pipeline from Gunlock Reservoir to SFRWRF
- Storage provides secondary irrigation to about 5,100 homes.

Secondary Irrigation Use

- Currently ~50% of residential water use is for outdoor landscaping.
- The City of St. George is currently working with the Washington County Water Conservancy District (WCWCD) and surrounding communities (Ivins, Santa Clara, Washington, Hurricane, LaVerkin, Toquerville) on a Landscape Ordinance, which will greatly reduce the amount of landscape (especially turf grass) that is allowed in all new development.

• New Landscape Ordinance could cut outdoor irrigation use in half.
