








# WE'RE RI!

As a national leader in research and graduate education, USU became one of just 137 institutions in the nation to attain the **Carnegie R1 Classification** for demonstrating "very high research activity."






## HIGH-IMPACT RESEARCH

#### Record \$368.5 Million Total Research Funding

About one-third of USU's revenues come from research funding. Our reputation as a leader in research resulted in a record amount of research funding in 2021—26% more than in 2020.





#### Best in the U.S.

Where most schools focus solely on graduate-level research opportunities, the **Council of Undergraduate Research** recognized our undergraduate research program as the best in the nation.

## **Brainwaves For a Cure**

Assistant Professor Yu Huang was awarded the National Institutes of Health's largest grant—the Maximizing Investigator's Research Award (MIRA)—to study how brains grow and brain cancer spreads.



#### **Opportunities for All**


#### **Electrifying New Tech**




#### Helping Utahns Breathe Easy
