


- Since 1967, University of Utah has trained more than **40,000** doctors, nurses, pharmacists, dentists, mid-level specialists, health providers, scientists, and educators.



- **More than 80% of our students are Utah residents** or college graduates



UTAH

- Spencer Fox Eccles School of Medicine is the **only academic medical center in the state**
- We train **2/3rds of the physicians in Utah**



- In FY21, we delivered more than **\$208M in uncompensated care**, including student run clinics
- Our students provide **health education programming for 13,000 K-12 students in Utah**



- **75 telehealth sites** across the state and region offering patients and other health providers **on-demand access to U of U Health providers**




- Our students participate in **numerous rural health programs** across the state


A NEW DAY FOR MEDICAL EDUCATION AT SPENCER FOX ECCLES SCHOOL OF MEDICINE




- **Transformative gift** from the Eccles family and foundations with \$30M for the building

- The School of Medicine Building was constructed in 1960's & has **outlived its useful life**
- Programs and administration are **dispersed across campus and the city**
- Technologies are **outdated**
- Building is **seismically challenged**
