
HB226S1 Higher Education and Corrections Council

HB226S1 establishes the Higher Education and Corrections Council which would create a comprehensive system to oversee the development and delivery of higher education programs to adult inmates in Utah correctional facilities. The Council will also advise the Utah Board of Higher Education, the Education Interim Committee, and the Higher Education Appropriations Committee with recommendations. Additionally, the Council will collect data tracking objectives and outcomes, including;

- methods of emphasizing programs that align with current and projected workforce demands of the state,
- use of coursework that encourages personal and civic development,
- the outcomes of formerly incarcerated people who have participated.



This bill provides for a single official coordinating body to help facilitate the great work that is already taking place within the state. This program works to bring educational opportunities by providing for-credit classes taught by volunteer students and professors.
