	(1) There is created a Wildlife Board which shall consist of seven members appoint

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by the governor with the advice and consent of the Senate in accordance with Title 63G,

34 Chapter 24, Part 2, Vacancies.

- 35 (2) (a) In addition to the requirements of Section 79-2-203, the members of the board
 36 shall have expertise or experience in at least one of the following areas:
- 37 (i) wildlife management or biology;

38 (ii) habitat management, including range or aquatic;

39 (iii) business, including knowledge of private land issues; and

40 (iv) economics, including knowledge of recreational wildlife uses.

41 (b) Each of the areas of expertise under Subsection (2)(a) shall be represented by at
42 least one member of the Wildlife Board.

43 (3) (a) The governor shall select each board member from a list of nominees submitted
44 by the nominating committee pursuant to Section 23-14-2.5.


