Re: Wildland Fire Cost Projections and Reserves

The Division of Forestry, Fire, and State Lands is responsible for the fire management on Utah's non-federal lands. During the 2022 General Session, the Legislature appropriated to the Wildland Fire Suppression Fund \$49 million one-time from the General Fund in FY 2023 for future fire suppression costs.

The numbers below reflect all fire suppression funding, including the amounts appropriated to the division and the funding available through the Wildland Fire Suppression Fund. Based on the projections, there would not be a need for a FY 2023 supplemental appropriation for fire suppression costs.
