### UTAH CODES

## 59-7-159 | 59 10-137 | 59 10-1007

In 1996, the Utah Legislature passed the Recycling Market Development Zone (RMDZ) Act to provide environmental and economic benefits to Utah businesses and citizens.



#### 4.95% Non refundable Tax Credit

on the purchase price of machinery and equipment used directly in commercial composting; or manufacturing facilities or plant units that manufacture, process, compound, or produce recycled items of tangible personal property for sale, or reduce or reuse post-consumer waste material

#### 20% Utah Income Tax Credit (up to \$2,000)

on eligible operating expenses, including payments made to third parties for rent, wages, supplies, tools, test inventory, and utilities, for establishing and operating recycling or composting technology in Utah.

# REQUIREMENTS

#### Municipality / County Zone Designation

Every Utah municipality and county is eligible to submit an application to designate a Recycling Market Development Zone.

- Identification of Local Contribution
- Summary of Local Recycling Program
- Support from Local Elected Officials
- Recycling Market Development Plan

#### **Business Tax Credit Application**

Qualifying purchases and expenditures must be certified by the Department of Environmental Quality.

- Complete RMDZ Worksheet
- Complete Tax Form TC-40R
- Submit Worksheet, Tax Form, Accompanying Receipts & Certification Statement




Verification & Letter Approval or Denial Is Issued

#### The purpose of the RMDZ credit:

- Provide tax credits to businesses that reuse materials that would otherwise be waste
- Increase recycling by individuals
- Stimulate economic growth

#### Benefits to the state include:


- Access to recycling centers
