



VITA: What is it?



- A federal grant program managed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).
- Supports free income tax preparation services for the underserved.
- VITA sites are operated by IRS grant partners and staffed by volunteers.



VITA: Who Qualifies for VITA Services?

- Taxpayers who make less than the maximum federal EITC threshold
- Persons with disabilities
- Limited English-speaking taxpayers
- Native Americans
- Underserved urban & rural communities
- Members of the Armed Forces and their spouses



VITA: Grants and Partners

Eligible partner organizations include public or private non-profits, public or private postsecondary institutions, local government agencies, and federally recognized Indian Tribal governments.

The grants are a 100% match.

VITA Grant Goals:

- Increase VITA services in hardest-to-reach areas across the country
- Increase taxpayer knowledge of available credits
- Increase the number of accurate returns filed electronically



VITA: Grants and Partners

Partners use funds for:

- Hiring staff to build relationships with community partners, recruiting and retaining volunteers
- Designing and producing marketing materials
- Administering VITA sites, including general operating costs

VITA: Volunteers

- VITA volunteers include greeters, intake specialists, interpreters, and tax preparers.
- Tax preparers are offered six courses of study.
- Preparers must pass exams and become certified each year by the IRS in order to volunteer at a partner site.





VITA: Tax Preparation Methods



- Traditional: one visit, in-person, screening, preparing, and quality reviewing the return.
- Virtual: two sites- intake and preparation, intake in-person and preparation completed via mail, fax, or video.
- Facilitated Self Assistance: taxpayers file on their own using a variety of question-based return software. This option is available at fusion, standalone, and remote sites.
