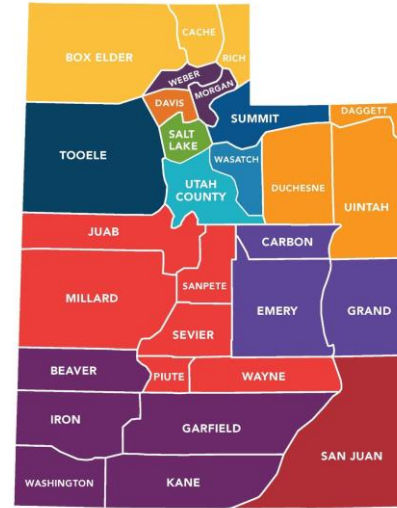

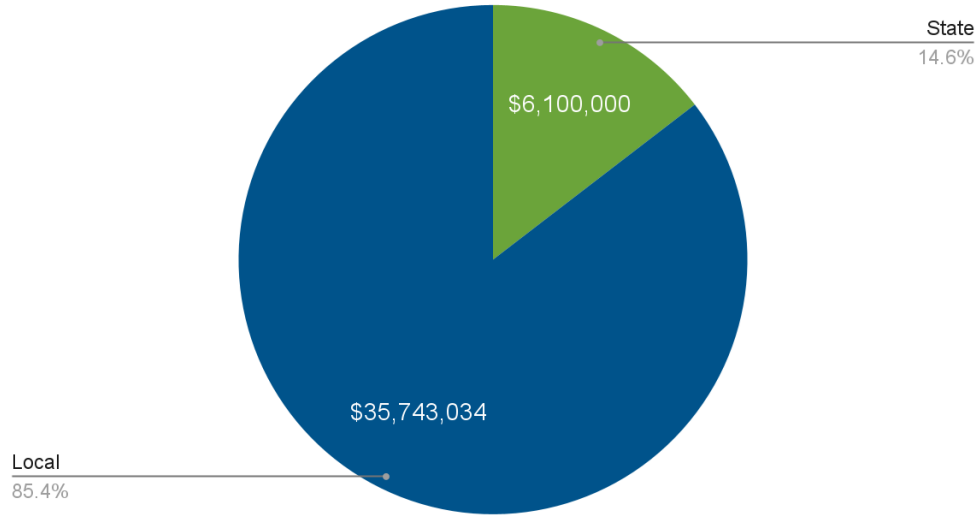
Cost to Implement State Standards

- Local Assessment
 - Wide variation in the estimated cost per capita
 - To cover minimum performance standards in rural areas, the per capita rate is higher due to the lower population density



How much does Utah pay for Minimum Performance Standards?

FY 22 Local Contributions

- Range: \$3.95 - \$43.13 per capita
 - \$35,743,034 County Contribution / 3,334,975 Utah Population = Statewide per capita in Utah **\$10.72**



Review of National Benchmark Profile

National Association of City and County Health Officials (NACCHO) 2019 profile study indicated that median funding for local health departments is \$17:

LOCAL \approx \$11 per capita

STATE \approx \$6 per capita

10 of the 29 counties are currently contributing \$11 or more
