A Large Utah LEA





- 3 Staff Members
 - 1 Parent
 - 3 Parent Group





0.00021% of the total library collection received a challenge



10 of 42 unique titles were removed



50 total books from 87 schools



District staff spent 500 hours reviewing the complaints





What We Know

- School personnel are intentional and thoughtful in determining sensitive materials
- Processes are in place
- USBE Library Specialist is essential
- Importance of professional learning for teacher librarians
- Parent involvement is crucial



Where We Can Improve

- Mismatches with library catalogues
- Practice in implementing new LEA policies



Additional Support Needed

- Clarification of applicable law:
 - Codified deadlines for Ongoing reporting
 - Application of three Utah Code Tests
- Funding to support the review process
