
Committee Charge




Approved heritage Preservation strategies

- Heritage Cove Monument commemorating regional significance of the term "Dixie"
- Film focusing on the heritage, culture, and history of the region, including the regional significance of the term "Dixie"
- Special Projects Visiting Assistant Librarian to work on projects specifically intended to preserve the region's heritage at the University



Heritage cove monument

- Located at the current site of the Pioneer Memorial Monument on UT's main campus
- Create additional memorial pieces highlighting the history of "Dixie," with topics including:
 - Music of Dixie
 - $\circ~$ Story of Dixie
 - Dixie Spirit
 - History of the University's names
 - Community support of the University



Film

- Documentary focusing on the heritage, culture, and history of the region, including the regional significance of the term "Dixie"
- Producing long and short versions of film
- Explores different aspects of the region known as "Dixie" including native inhabitants, settlers, spirit, culture, and present-day position in Utah and the nation
- Includes interviews of local historians, educators and entrepreneurs



Special collections and Archives project

- Hire a Special Projects Visiting Assistant Librarian to work on projects specifically intended to preserve the region's heritage, including the term "Dixie"
- Repository to be in University Special Collections and Archives and open to the public
