

Blue is the foundation of the flag as an honor to the current flag, to suggest natural resources such as lakes and sky, and principles such as knowledge, freedom, and optimism.

The beehive represents community and our state's nickname as the Beehive State, and Industry.

Strength and unity.

BUILDING THE FLAG: HEXAGON



The gold hexagon rim around the beehive stands for strength and cradles the beehive to represent unity.

WHITE MOUNTAIN RANGE


SYMBOLISM

The rugged white band represents our state's mountain landscapes, as well as peace.

SOUTHERN UTAH

SYMBOLISM

Landscape and perseverance.

SYMBOLISM: COLORS



Nod to the American flag, but warmer in hue to give Utah a unique identity while symbolizing the southern Utah landscape.

ORANGE

While this is the literal color of the landscape to the south, residents preferred red rocks rather than orange rocks.

BUILDING THE FLAG: RED ROCKS



The red evokes the red rocks of southern Utah, while the color also symbolizes perseverance.


STAR

Hope, guidance, and diversity.

Eight-pointed star represents the eight federally-recognized Tribes in Utah.
