HIGHLIGHTS:

Federal Grant Applications Requiring Legislative Action

Seven grants, totaling \$14,679,659, require approval from the Executive Appropriations Committee. Two of the seven grants require \$1,083,272 of matching funding, which will be covered by existing program expenses. Three of the grants are new and the remaining four are reapplications.

Federal Grant Applications Approved by the Governor's Office

Nine grants, totaling \$1,169,216, have been approved by the Governor's Office. None of the grants have matching requirements. Six of the grants are new and the remaining three are reapplications or are supplemental authority for grants exceeding 125% of appropriations.
