Victim Services Appropriations

Victims of crime are your neighbor, sibling, parent, coworker, relative, or friend. Victims cross all socioeconomic, race, gender, and age populations. Every victim of crime deserves to have access to comprehensive social services from trauma informed providers within their community and through the criminal justice process.

CHILD ABUSE

At least 1 in 7 children have experienced child abuse or neglect in the past year in the United States. 1



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Over 1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men in the US have experienced rape. physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner in their lifetime.2



SEXUAL VIOLENCE

Nearly 1 in 3 women will experience some form of sexual violence in their lifetime.3 At least 1 in 6 men have experienced sexual abuse or assault in their lifetime.4



VICTIM SERVICES FUNDING CRISIS


Victim service agencies like Children Justice Centers, Domestic Violence Shelters, and Rape Crisis Centers serve hundreds of thousands of victims all throughout the state. These agencies are already underfunded and are now facing federal grant cuts from 30-40%, which equates to a 6-8 million dollar decrease per year. These cuts are due to the instability of federal funding sources and having minimal state funding support. The victim service appropriation would allow stability and growth in funding resources. This proposed funding and stabilization would allow victim service agencies to provide a more comprehensive trauma informed response to victims of crime.
