




Enrollment History - Headcount






Enrollment History - FTE






Statewide Attainment Goal Metrics

Access: Share of high school graduates enrolled at Tooele Technical College within 3 years








Timely Completion: Share of awards completed within 1.5 time









- Learn & Work funded 52% (57 students) of our CDL Students





Student Demographics FY 2022







Building Expansion Update

- Last Session \$24.7 Million
- Assumptions used for Funding Request
 - Cost Estimate Completed in July 2021
 - If Funded, We hoped to begin in July 2022
 - DFCM Included an 8% Cost Escalation Factor

Extreme Cost Escalation

- Funding required a March 2023 Start Date
- Actual Inflation/Cost Escalation
 - Materials 14 27%
 - Labor 11 21%


