Approved Curriculum

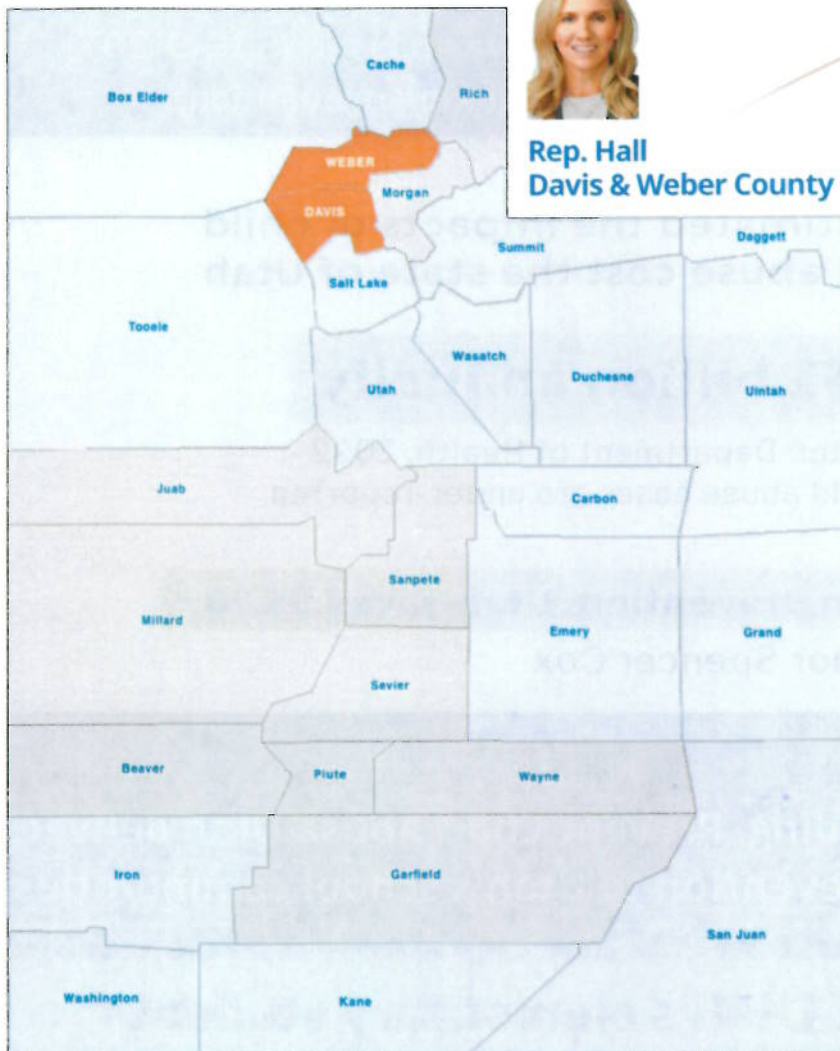
Prevent Child Abuse Utah's classroom-based curriculum is the only one approved by USBE for Utah's K-6 students

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Child Abuse & Trafficking Prevention

1 in 7 Utah children will be sexually abused by age 18

90% of the time, children are sexually abused by someone they know and trust



In 2014, Utah's Child Sexual Abuse Prevention law was passed (53G-9-207).
In 2019, the law was updated to include trafficking prevention.



It is estimated the impacts of child sexual abuse cost the state of Utah

\$1 billion annually

Through private funding, Prevent Child Abuse Utah delivers child abuse prevention to Utah's school communities.

89% of Utah's elementary students are NOT receiving prevention education.

Elementary schools in 10 of Utah's rural counties have never received child abuse prevention training.
